Through community organising, Christians in inner-city London have been at the heart of successful campaigns for the Living Wage, an 'ethical Olympics' and the end to child detention in the asylum process. In the process, they have deepened relationships with local people of all faiths and none.

Named after the 1920s slum priest Fr Basil Jellicoe, this Community enables Oxford students to work with — and learn from — churches organising for social justice.
